Scholarship Application and Instructions

Applications Accepted: March 26 – June 15, 2010 (Postmark Deadline)

Since inception, the National Association of Black Accountants, Inc. St. Louis Chapter (NABA) has provided over \$275,000 in scholarship funds to deserving students. Through the generous contributions of individuals, groups, and organizations that share NABA’s desire to break through the economic barrier minorities often experience, NABA offers scholarships on a local level.

Scholarship applications will be accepted by the **St. Louis Metropolitan Chapter** from March 26, 2010 – June 15, 2010 (Postmark Deadline)

The scholarships will be presented by the **NABA St. Louis Metropolitan Chapter** at the **30th Annual Scholarship Gala on September 10, 2010** at the **Missouri Athletic Club in downtown St. Louis, Missouri. Your scholarship award is contingent on your ability to participate in the Scholarship Gala.** All applicants receive one complimentary ticket to the luncheon. Awardees receive one additional complimentary ticket for a guest. The actual cash awards will be made from the NABA St. Louis Chapter post-gala with receipt of proof of enrollment for the period(s) covered by the award. The period covered will be January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2011.

Applicants Must:

1. Be an ethnic minority.
2. Meet the minimum required GPA or better in your major and overall. *Please provide a conversion of your grades to the “4.0 grading scale” if your college or university does not use this scale.*
3. Be a NABA **student** member majoring in Accounting, Finance or Business, whose membership dues have been received by NABA's National Office **no later than the scholarship application deadline (June 15, 2010).** **Special Note:** Regardless of the circumstances, once becoming a professional member, you are not permitted to return to student status. Graduate students must have entered graduate school immediately after receiving their undergraduate degree in order to maintain student status and be eligible for a scholarship.
4. Be currently enrolled at a four-year United States college or university as a full-time (12 semester hours or equivalent), **undergraduate** freshman, sophomore, junior, or first-year senior accounting, finance, or business major **or** be a full-time **graduate** student (9 semester hours or equivalent) enrolled or accepted into a master’s-level business program. Finance and business majors must have completed six (6) hours of accounting coursework.
5. **Current high school seniors are eligible at the regional and local level only.** Distribution of funds to high school awardees will occur upon documentation of NABA student membership and entry into a college or university.

Note: Scholarships may have other specific criteria that are not identified on this application.

APPLICATION MATERIALS**Please submit the following:**

- ❑ A completed **NABA St. Louis Chapter Scholarship Application**. Please type or clearly print your responses, including "N/A" for items that are not applicable to you. The application **MUST** be completed in its entirety, submitted with the items listed below, and is accepted **ONLY** from **March 26 – June 15, 2010 (postmark deadline)**.
- ❑ An official current **Academic Transcript (through the fall 2009 semester)**. You must request that your University's or High School registrar forward the transcript directly to you or the NABA St. Louis Chapter. We will not accept student copies or other unofficial transcripts. **High School Students must provide report card.**
- ❑ A clear copy of Student/Permanent Resident Visa (only if applicant **IS NOT** a United States citizen).
- ❑ A Current **Resume**.
- ❑ Two (2) **Letters of Recommendation**. One must be from a member of the accounting/business faculty at your college/university. The other may be from a **non-relative** who is familiar with your academic and/or professional performance (i.e. employer, advisor, etc.). **High School applicants must provide one (1) Letter of Recommendation from a faculty member at your high school.**
- ❑ A **Personal Biography** of **100 words**. Your biography should specifically discuss your career objectives, leadership abilities, community activities, and **your involvement in NABA** (include any offices held, exceptional achievements, and/or special recognition).
- ❑ If you are a student who has demonstrated the character to persevere by overcoming a personal, family, or financial hardship, please include an additional statement of 150 words or less describing the circumstances and how the obstacles were overcome. The "Lifting as We Climb" Award is dedicated to these students.

Postmark Deadline: June 15, 2010

Awards are made for the following calendar year. Applicants in 2010 should be pursuing scholarships for the Spring 2011 - Fall 2011 school year. Award recipients will be notified by August 1 2010. Scholarship disbursements will take place prior to each academic semester (spring, summer, fall 2011). Awards will be mailed either to the student or directly to the school (based on the recipient's preference).

Applications Accepted: March 26 – June 15, 2010 (Postmark Deadline)

It is your responsibility to ensure that your financial aid office and registrar have enough time (usually three to four weeks) to get the required items to you or the NABA St. Louis Chapter. We can only accept original documents. Faxed materials will not be accepted. NABA St. Louis Chapter is not responsible for items lost or improperly handled by the mail carrier services. We recommend having the scholarship package sent by certified mail. **Please plan carefully so that your application receives the consideration it deserves.**

Please note that by submitting your application you agree to a minimum 2 year membership (current and next fiscal year). High School applicants much agree to a one year membership for the next fiscal year. The \$20 cost of membership will be deducted from the Scholarship award.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When will monetary awards be provided?

Monetary awards are mailed post-gala once proof of enrollment is received from the recipient. If you are planning to use the award towards tuition for the upcoming semester, please be advised that it can take up to 2 - 3 weeks to receive the award once proof of enrollment is received from you. It is important to make plans around tuition accordingly.

What is proof of enrollment?

Every scholarship recipient is required to show proof that they will be matriculating as a full-time student for the semester following the Scholarship Gala (Spring Semester 2011). The same applies to those scholars going on to graduate school. Proof of enrollment can take the form of a letter from the registrar or receipt/confirmation of your online registration from your school. It must include your name, listing of courses for the spring semester, and an indication that it is from your school's official website.

Are scholarship awards made payable to the student or the school?

Awards are made payable to the scholarship recipient unless otherwise requested.

It says in the application that we are required to attend the Scholarship Gala. When should we arrive?

When you apply for the Scholarship you are agreeing to attend the scholarship gala. The gala is September 10, 2010 6pm at the Missouri Athletic Club in downtown St. Louis, Missouri. The NABA Scholarship Committee will communicate the expected arrival time to you.

Once I am a confirmed scholarship recipient, what should I do next?

All scholarship recipients will receive periodic emails from a NABA St. Louis Chapter Executive Board Member which will provide information on how to prepare for the Scholarship Gala event, what to pack, what to expect and what is expected of you.

Will scholars be expected to cover any expenses during the gala?

No. Scholarship recipients will not be expected to cover the meal cost for the gala and you will receive one complimentary ticket for a guest.
